HEALING TOGETHER

When a resident passes, there is difficulty in knowing how to best support their grieving friends and community. Healing Together is an art therapy group that provides a space for residents to mourn, celebrate, and come together to create an art piece in memory of a resident who recently passed. Healing Together began in January of 2023 by Miriam Hudson as a response to residents needing support through their grief of loved ones from Misericordia. Miriam is an art therapist and counselor, who provides individual and group counseling at Misericordia. Since Healing Together began, there have been seven sessions which have served forty-five residents.

Healing Together is a single session that lasts seventy-five minutes. During the session residents can share memories, talk about other loved ones they've lost, and ask questions about where their friend is. The group is for residents who are mourning and needing a space to process that their friend no longer being here. By gathering and creating art together we are illustrating community through togetherness. Residents can see that they are not alone in their grief, there are caring people to support them, and that their friend will always be remembered.

During the session the group creates an art piece in honor of the resident who recently passed. Each group creates a piece unique to the deceased resident, for example a group made a faux stained-glass window to represent how the person lit up every room they were in. After the pieces are completed the participants of the group can choose where they would like to install their art. Many of the participants place their pieces in either the common room of their home or their bedroom. The piece acts as a memorial for the passed resident and a way to still have them be part of the home.

To coordinate a Healing Together session please contact Miriam Hudson. Along with Healing Together for grieving residents, Misericordia also offers Restore and Remember for grieving residents. Restore and Remember was created by Sarah Peters and Andrew Bloomquist in 2017 as a space for staff to come together and remember a recently passed resident.

Congratulations to the eleven staff who recently completed Tier 2: Essential Skills for Teamwork of Misericordia's Fit for Success program. Using our five core values as an anchor to our discussions, participants spent the past six weeks exploring what it means to be a team player at Mis and discussing the key skills needed for effective leadership for our support teams. Participants were divided into three teams throughout the sessions and each team presented their learnings and reflections to members of Misericordia's leadership team last Thursday, July 6. We are humbled and inspired by their thoughts, creativity, willingness to seek solutions and overall commitment to Misericordia. Thank you all for sharing your gifts and talents! More information on dates for the next round of Tier 1 of Fit for Success will be shared soon!

HIRING AND RETENTION INITIATIVES

Misericordia is currently trialing a different approach to fill DSP openings. Historically, residential areas might have 1-2 staff hired for a training class, which may only have a small impact on openings. The hope is that by focusing hiring efforts on 2 areas at a time, there is an opportunity to provide some stability in those areas in order to then shift the focus on hiring to other areas. Additionally, the intention is to build a strong peer network by having a group of people for designated areas start and train at the same time. Ideally, these cohorts can learn and grow together and support each other in their learning and development. Currently, Human Resources is focusing recruiting efforts on Marian Center and Rosemary/Connelly/McGowan for the DSP training class that begins 7/24/2023. We will follow this new hire cohort closely, involving members from the RATE team (**see the next page for details**) early on, and providing focused support in order to have a greater impact on our campus openings. Should this trial be successful, we will replicate this in other areas on campus. Look for updates in future Campus Connections.

"RETENTION ACTION TEAM FOR EXCELLENCE"

In May 2023, a team was put together to focus on our goal to improve employee retention. This team is called the RATE team, which stands for Retention Action Team for Excellence to positively impact employee engagement and retention rate.

The team met over a 4 week period to construct a format to positively impact retention of our newly hired (0-6 months) employees.

- In the short term, as a primary priority to address retention of new hires
- In the long term, embed into onboarding, as a secondary priority

Team members were identified to represent different levels and areas across the organization:

- Kristina Lipsey- HR/Staff Development
- Amara Tyler- AVP, Residential
- Mary Frances Schultz- Director, DT and Programs
- Sydney Rebella- ADON, Nursing
- Madelyne Trejo- VP, Clinical Services

Goal: establish a process to reach out/touch base with new employees through their on-boarding to create further connection to their role.

Initial areas of focus: Quinlan, McAuley, Marion, Mercy Glen, CDS, Rosemary Connelly, McGowan staff.

The Fit for Success graduates were identified as the optimal group to increase engagement with new hires, as they are equipped with heightened communication and listening skills to connect with newer hires and facilitate small check-in sessions. These points of contact are not meant to be large or complicated in scale...rather they are meant to be a simple opportunity to connect with the newer staff, to help them feel more connected/engaged, and garner some real-time feedback on the initial legs of their journey.

Overall feedback has been very positive!

Next steps: we are looking to identify Fit For Success candidates within each area, so that this process can be further streamlined.

WORKFORCE GROWTH PROJECT: CHILDCARE ASSISTANCE SURVEY PLEASE COMPLETE BY FRIDAY

Misericordia is participating in a collaborative grant funded by the Coleman Foundation to find solutions to workforce challenges in recruitment and retention. For the past few months, Fr. Bart Winters and Geana Connelly have been meeting with the Workforce Growth Project Representatives to explore the feasibility of offering a child care assistance program for our Misericordia staff. We are collecting information to gauge your interest and need for childcare assistance. Though no decision has been made to begin such a program, it is important to survey our staff to gauge any interest. We would like you to complete the attached child care survey, created by the Workforce Growth Project, in order to determine whether to pursue our exploration of the feasibility of such a program at Misericordia.

We want to emphasize that no decision has been made to start a child care program. If we decide to pursue it, the project would take several years. Before going down that path, we want to determine if it is something our staff would want and use.

SECURITY UPDATE

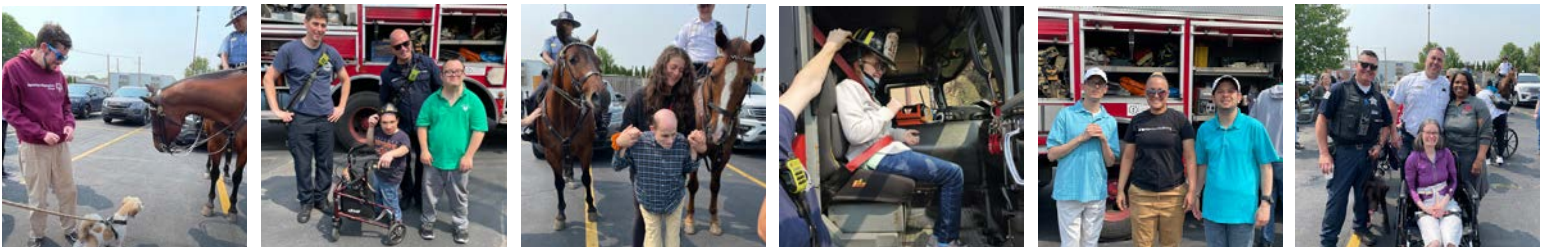
A recent incident involving two suspicious men trespassing on campus has required the Misericordia Administration to ask for everyone's help to ensure the safety of our Misericordia community.

Effective immediately:

1. ALL employees are required to wear and have visible their Misericordia employee ID while on any part of the campus.
2. Employees may be asked by security and reception to provide an ID when entering and while on campus. Please don't be insulted, security and reception are just doing their part in keeping us safe!
3. If you observe a person(s) on campus who is NOT wearing an employee ID or not wearing a temporary visitor's ID, please contact reception immediately at 773-973-6300. Provide your location, their location and a description of the person and a security officer will be dispatched to assist.
4. If you are approached by a person asking for assistance, kindly respond, "I will contact security to come and assist you" and then contact reception at 773-973-6300.
5. Please, do not assist any person, without an ID or a temporary visitor's ID, with entry into a secured building without security's assistance!
6. If at any time you feel your safety or the safety of our residents is at risk, call 911.
7. And as always, if you "See Something, Say Something!". Call reception at 773-973-6300 and ask them to contact Misericordia Security and provide the relevant information.
8. Dial 911 to report any suspicious activity, people, or vehicles on campus that pose an immediate or serious threat to our Misericordia community.

You can make a difference! You are the eyes and ears of Misericordia and the first line of defense in the effort to make Misericordia a safer place. We ask that all Misericordia employees work at doing their part to make Misericordia a safer place.

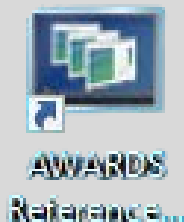

UNDERSTANDING CATHOLIC IDENTITY

SYNOD ON SYNODALITY

The Catholic Church is currently engaging in a global listening process open to everyone and aimed at renewing our ability to live out our mission and build up our communion in our own particular times and places. It is called *The Synod on Synodality*.

A synod is a gathering of the faithful with their pastors in order to listen to what the Holy Spirit is saying to the Church. Synods have taken many forms in church history and they are already practiced in the Church at all levels: from local parish councils and national assemblies to the Synod of Bishops, when bishops from across the world gather in Rome with the Pope.

This Synod is an invitation to engage with those on the margins of our Church and society, an opportunity to encounter those who may disagree with us or think differently than us. Everyone's voice and experience are vital to the path we are asked to walk together throughout this process. This time of listening and dialogue is an invitation to adopt an orientation of welcome and understanding, to return to our mission, and build communion. As we do so we can both strengthen our faith and remain true to our teachings while deepening our relationships with all the People of God.

This synod is an invitation to really listen to the lived experiences of the whole of the People of God and discern, together, where the Spirit is calling us as a Church. This may not always be a straightforward process and does not have any set outcomes or intended benchmarks.
